After moving back home to Boonville in 2008, Corey noticed the desperate need for recreation activities that didn’t burdened families financially as well

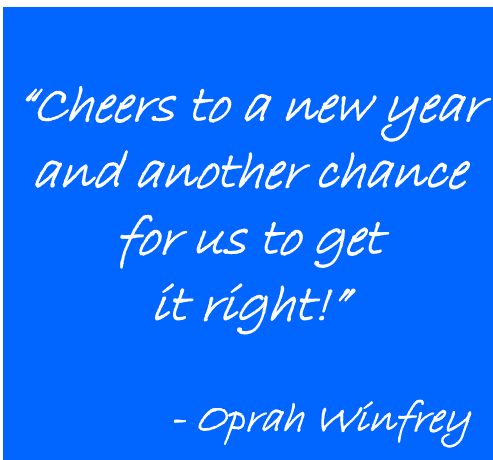
as an effective after school program for youth struggling academically. Having that passion to help these families is what led Corey to CCBC.

The Chamber of Commerce presented the CCBC Board with the New Partner award during their Annual Dinner, Tuesday, January 13, 2015.

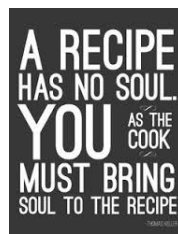


After receiving the award, Corey Wright stated that the organization’s new movement started with just a building and we let our faith do the rest.
