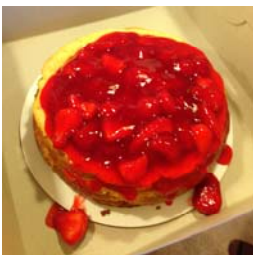
CCBC. The lemonade tumbler used for this fundraiser was compliments of Tyron Jackson.
